# 1 Samuel 15 | Week 8

#### **INTRO**

→ Springtime is almost here! Have everyone in your group share what they are most excited for in the new season.

# **READ AND DISCUSS (15 Min)**

Have someone read 1 Samuel 15. (Break the passage up and encourage multiple people to read). Ask and discuss as a group the following three questions.

- → What does this passage teach us about God? What does this passage teach me about who he is (his nature and character), what does this passage teach me about the way he interacts with his creation?
- → What does this passage teach us about man? What does this passage teach us about the condition of man? Our sinful nature? Our need for a savior?
- → What do you feel led to do in response to this passage? Is there something we need to do? Is there a sin I need to confess? A relationship I need to reconcile? A song to sing? With these questions we are asking people to consider how this passage informs the way they interact with God, with other people, and the world.

#### **APPLY**

→ Samuel told Saul that he had been disobedient to God (vs. 19), and Saul disagreed. What do you think? Did Saul receive a just punishment for his actions? Encourage group members to explain their answers. Use this as an opportunity to talk about the difference between full obedience and partial obedience.

- → How did Saul try to cover his disobedience?
- → In what ways do you identify with Saul? How are you tempted to cover up your sin?
- → Read 1 Samuel 15:22-23. What is God's judgment against Saul?
- → Out of this same text, what does God really want from Saul? What does he want from us?
- → What does it do to your heart to know that our disobedience can only be overcome by the good news of Jesus?

## **Pray**

- → Pray prayers of praise to God who has covered our sin with his righteousness (2 Corinthians 5:21).
- → Pray for the Deacons God would raise up to care for the needs of Mercy Church.
