2 Samuel 1 | Week 15

INTRO

→ What gas station snack best describes your personality?

READ AND DISCUSS (15 Min)

Read 2 Samuel 1 together as a group and discuss the following questions.

- → What does this passage teach us about God? What does this passage teach me about who he is (his nature and character), what does this passage teach me about the way he interacts with his creation?
- → What does this passage teach us about man? What does this passage teach us about the condition of man? Our sinful nature? Our need for a savior?
- → What do you feel led to do in response to this passage? Is there something we need to do? Is there a sin I need to confess? A relationship I need to reconcile? A song to sing? With these questions we are asking people to consider how this passage informs the way they interact with God, with other people, and the world.

APPLY

→ Pastor Rashard opened his sermon with the following quote from Dr. Martin Luther King
- "Actually, time is neutral. It can be used either destructively or constructively. I am
coming to feel that the people of ill will have used time much more effectively than the
people of good will. We will have to repent in this generation not merely for the vitriolic
words and actions of the bad people but for the appalling silence of the good people."

Do you agree with this quote from Dr. King? What do you think he meant by it?

→ How does this quote from Dr. King help us think about the way we use our time on earth in light of eternity?

- → The death of Saul and Jonathan brought grief to David, because he loved them.

 The author of Samuel was intentional to show us David's grief in verses 11 and 12.

 Why is it important for us to see this? And why is it important for us to be intentional to grieve our losses?
- → Pastor Rashard explained from this passage, 5 ways we will be remembered when we die
 - ◆ We will be remembered for how we responded to our failures.
 - ◆ We will be remembered for our fight.
 - ◆ We will be remembered for the way we served others.
 - ◆ We will be remembered for the friendships we cultivated.
 - ◆ We will be remembered by whose glory we lived for (our own or God's).

Discuss these five as a group. How do each of the above statements challenge you to evaluate the way you are living your life?

→ As you wrap up your time as a group, discuss how the gospel gives us hope in our grief. Discuss how the gospel helps respond to our failures, persevere in the fight against sin, serve others, cultivate deep friendships, and live for the glory of God and not our own.

Pray:

Tonight in prayer, make time for men and women to pray separately and discuss the following questions Pastor Rashard presented to us in his sermon.

→ What area of disobedience is harming your future fruit? Is there anything you must remedy, or any relationship you must repair, before the end of your life? How are you learning from your failures to teach more about how to love God and others?

Additional prayer prompts to guide your time:

- → Pray that we would have the courage to face our grief with the hope of the gospel.
- → Pray that Mercy would be a place that many people experience healing from past hurts.
- → Pray that you would live a life that is worthy of the gospel
